

Uniform Policy

The Sittingbourne School



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1. Policy Statement

The Sittingbourne School holds high expectations and standards for all our young people, and we encourage a professional learning environment which prepares our students for the world of work and employability. We are developing a reputation in the local community as being a school that is well respected for its high standards and as an integral part of that we encourage our students to wear their uniform with pride. The wearing of uniform also removes opportunities for peer pressure and bullying with all students dressed to the same standard.

All Sittingbourne School students are therefore expected to maintain this high standard by coming to school smartly dressed in their full school uniform and wearing it in the conventional school style.

To further maintain this high standard of uniform, students are not allowed to wear any jewellery, including earrings and any other piercing, with the exception of a wristwatch. (We would recommend that ears should be pierced only at the beginning of a main holiday to allow time for healing so the earrings can be removed on return to school.) Discreet, natural make-up is allowed; however, any form of painted or acrylic nails, or brightly coloured make-up is not.

Parents and carers are reminded that you must be at least 18 years before you can have a tattoo; it is illegal for anyone to have a tattoo under 18 even with a guardian's consent.

The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are reasons linked to religion or beliefs that require a particular dress code - for example, wearing or carrying a specific religious artefact, dressing modestly or covering of the head - the school will look sympathetically at such requests. We will also consider the needs of individual students where the uniform policy may need to be adapted. If any parent has comments/ideas relating to school uniform they should make representation to the Headteacher in the first instance.

2. Aims

This policy aims to provide clear expectations for all stakeholders to ensure that all members of our school community can be included.

We anticipate the full support of parents and carers in maintaining a high standard of dress and see the wearing of the school uniform correctly as the responsibility of all members of the school community: students, parents/carers and staff. This policy will be used by all staff in conjunction with the school's behaviour policy and non-compliance of uniform expectations will be addressed by communities. Students not conforming to our uniform expectations, and not willing to resolve any issues, may be sent home to change or will be isolated within school. In order to support, students without correct uniform will be lent the required items by the school for a short period of time; they are expected to comply with this and return the items at the end of the school day. Students refusing to borrow the required clothing may not be permitted in lessons and parents will be contacted.

We do understand that the initial expense of a school uniform can be costly, but over time it has been found that it becomes more affordable, avoids conflict and is more manageable both for the students and their families. In order to support the expense, only our blazer, tie and school PE top are restricted to our school uniform suppliers, with generic items such as skirts, trousers and shirts being widely available from the large retailers. To further support in this initial outlay, one of our main suppliers also provides a six-weekly payment plan for the purchase of uniform.

In order to prevent lost items, we ask that all items of uniform are clearly marked with the owner's name. This is particularly essential for blazers and P.E. kit, which are both easily misplaced and expensive to replace.

3. Travelling to and from school

When students are travelling by public transport, or are walking or cycling to or from school, they are expected to conform to the uniform policy.

All students should have a strong school bag of a suitable size for school, large enough to carry an A4 book. Minimum essential equipment includes a pen, pencil and ruler.

Students are expected to wear their full uniforms on attendance to any school trips.

4. Uniform Expectations

As a guide, skirts should be longer than the ends of the fingertips when arms and hands are held straight down by the side of the body.

5. Summer uniform

To address the high temperatures we typically experience in the summer term, the school uniform is as follows for **Term 6 only**:

7. Jewellery & make-up

8. Equipment

All students will be required to bring to school sufficient equipment to engage in a full day's learning. Students must have the following items with them every day in school:

- A bag big enough to carry A4 exercise books to and from school
- Black or blue ink pens
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Scientific calculator
- Reading book (from school library)
- Reusable water bottle

9. Provision of Second-Hand Uniform

In line with Department for Education guidance to ensure school uniform remains affordable and sustainable for all families, The Sittingbourne School operates a pre-loved uniform scheme.

- Availability: High-quality, second-hand uniform items are available for purchase directly from our Student Services department.
- Stock and Pricing: Available items fluctuate depending on supply but typically include core uniform pieces and PE kit at significantly reduced prices.
- Uniform Donations: To keep this scheme running successfully, we kindly ask parents and carers to donate any clean, good-condition uniform items that their children have outgrown. Donations can be dropped off at the main school reception at any time during the school year.

10. Compliance with the Equality Act 2010

The Sittingbourne School is committed to promoting equality, celebrating diversity and ensuring that our uniform policy does not unfairly disadvantage any student. In accordance with the Equality Act 2010, the school ensures its uniform expectations are practical, inclusive, and non-discriminatory across all protected characteristics.

Religious and Cultural Dress

The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are reasons linked to religion or beliefs that require a specific dress code—such as wearing or carrying a specific religious artefact, dressing modestly or covering the head—the school will look sympathetically at such requests.

Race and Cultural Heritage

Our policy avoids race-based discrimination by ensuring that uniform and appearance standards are inclusive of all cultural backgrounds. This includes welcoming protective hairstyles, natural Afro hair, cornrows, braids, locks and twists, in line with the Halo Code and national equality guidelines.

Sex and Gender Identity

The Sittingbourne School provides a gender-neutral uniform framework. All students, regardless of sex or gender identity, have equal access to the same uniform options, including trousers, skirts, and shorts (during Term 6).

Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

We recognise that some students may have specific medical conditions, physical disabilities or sensory processing needs that make certain aspects of the standard uniform challenging to wear. The school will consider the needs of individual students where the uniform policy may need to be adapted.

Making a Request: Parents or carers who wish to request a reasonable adjustment or adaptation to the uniform policy on the grounds of religion, belief, medical need or disability should make representation to the Headteacher in the first instance. Each request will be considered thoroughly and compassionately on an individual basis.

11. Common questions and answers

Q) Trainers/a hoody/earrings don't disturb their learning so why can't my child wear them in school?

A) As soon as there is variation in what a child can wear there becomes the option for the item to be either expensive or cheap, fashionable or unfashionable. Once this happens, students can feel anxious about falling victim to unkind comments for wearing the "wrong" type of clothing or jewellery. Therefore, to reduce anxiety, increase safety and reduce potential distractions caused by students wearing "fashion items" in class, uniform is compulsory for all students. When wearing a hood, it makes an individual harder to identify. This can then cause a safety issue as we may be unable to identify if a person is meant to be on the school site or not.

Q) Uniform can be expensive. What shall I do if I can't afford to buy/replace what is needed?

A) Any parents/carers who are struggling to purchase the required uniform should contact their child's year team. We are able to provide support to families by lending or purchasing items to/for students to ensure they comply with the uniform policy.

Q) My child had their ears/nose pierced over the holiday/for their birthday but the hole will heal up if they take the piercing out within two weeks. Can they keep the earring/nose stud in for just a week or two to prevent this?

A) We would recommend that ears should be pierced only at the beginning of a main holiday term (not half term holidays as they are only one week long) to allow time for healing so the earrings can be removed on return to school. All jewellery other than a watch will be confiscated if seen in school.

Q) In the summer months, why can't students just wear PE kit?

A) It's understandable why some might suggest wearing a PE kit during the summer months. However, crucially for summer comfort, we believe students will actually be cooler in their white cotton school shirts with shorts or skirts than in a navy polyester PE kit. Cotton is a natural, breathable fabric that allows for better air circulation and prevents sweat more effectively than polyester, especially in direct sunlight. Darker colours like navy also absorb more heat.

In addition, while our PE kit is designed for physical activity, it's not intended as a substitute for a full school uniform. The school uniform, even with summer adaptations, maintains a level of formality and distinction that the PE kit doesn't. This helps foster a more focused and academic environment, setting it apart from sports lessons.
